Relay For Life

This year, our chapter participated in Lansing's American Cancer Society's Relay for Life event which was held on June 5-6th at the Lansing Catholic High School. Relay for Life is 24 hour walking event where teams of people take shifts walking to raise awareness and funds for cancer research.

Our initial goal of raising \$2,000 was well surpassed by the efforts of our team, Luminiara sales and a bake sale that occurred during the event. Also, Andrea Hoard petitioned Fazoli's Restaurant on Saginaw to hold three days where 15% of sales (with a coupon) would go towards our fundraising goal. In total, we raised

\$2,942.66!!!

During the event, we decided to go with an 80's cartoon theme, and many of the team members wore t-shirts with various cartoon characters on them. The campsite was also decorated with various cartoon shows from the 80's. In all, 17 members plus friends and family


