Yellow Ribbon: Do you remember when we used to be involved in a great project called Yellow Ribbon? The purpose of this project was to help prevent teen suicide. The premise is simple, communication. Talk to teens in your community, letting them know there are other options and that they are not alone. This program used to involve chapters bringing in guest speakers to things like high school assemblies and special events. We would talk about statistics, where to go for help and how to recognize the warning signs. We would also provide people with cards that had area hotline numbers on it and ones that simply said, "I want help." If someone ever felt like they were alone or even thought about suicide, they would give these cards to someone they knew, no words needed. This was an easy way for them to reach out for support. Recently I have had a chapter contact me to see about re-starting this program. What I want to know is if your chapter would want to get involved? Is this something you would like information on? Please, let me know. We'd like to try to get this running second quarter if possible!
