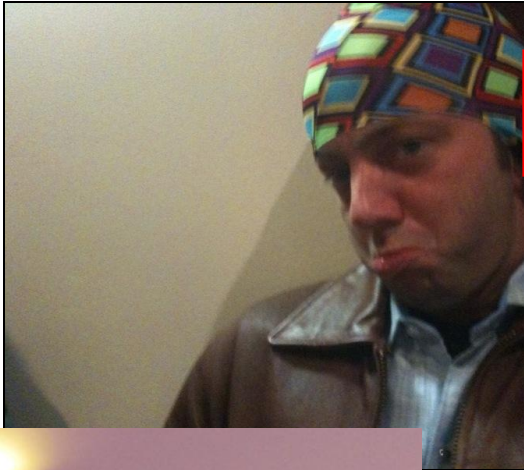

Sam Street Hughes Memorial Award “Springboard of the Year” – this award is given to a member with less than one year of experience in recognition of outstanding contribution.

The C. William Brownfield Memorial Award “New Jaycee of the Year” – presented to a member that has completed their first year as a Jaycee.

The Paul D. Bagwell Memorial Award “Spirit of the Jaycees” – awarded to the member who best exemplified the Jaycees Spirit.

The Robert M. Reames Memorial Award “Outstanding Leadership” – this award is presented to the member who is recognized as an outstanding leader within the Lansing Jaycees.

President’s Award is given to the member(s) who the President determines had the biggest impact on the chapter during the past year.

The John H. Armbruster Memorial Award “Key Member” is the highest award presented by the Lansing Jaycees each year. It is voted on by past key members.

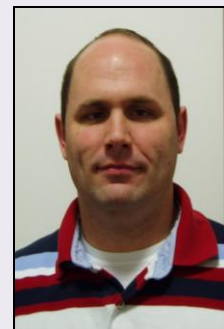
Well, it's hard to believe we are in the throes of the holiday season. I just want to pass along a few wishes I have for you:
