Locks of Love Project in the works!

Locks of Love is a non-profit organization that provides hairpieces to financially disadvantaged children under the age of 18 who have long term medical hair loss from chemotherapy or other medical conditions such as alopecia. The following are the guidelines from the Locks of Love website, www.locksoflove.com:

- 10-inch minimum hair length (tip to tip) no wigs, falls or synthetic hair
- · Please bundle hair in ponytail or braid.
- · Hair needs to be clean, dry, placed in a plastic bag, then a padded envelope.
- · Hair from men and women, young and old, all colors and races.
- · Hair may be colored or permed, but not bleached or chemically damaged (if unsure, ask your stylist).
- · Hair swept off the floor is not usable.
- · Hair cut years ago is usable if it has been stored in a ponytail or braid.
- · Hair that is short, gray or unsuitable for children will be separated from the ponytails and sold at fair market value to offset the cost of manufacturing.
- · You may pull curly hair straight to measure the minimum 10 inches.
- The majority of all hair donated comes from children who wish to help other children.
- · Layered hair may be divided into multiple ponytails for donation.
- · Please note: Anyone can cut your hair as long as the above guidelines are followed.

Three members have already committed to growing their hair for this project, including Amy Miller, Dianne Perukel and Tracy Prush! Please join us in supporting this great organization. We are seeking a co-sponsor for this event, such as a salon or several independent cosmetologists. 2006 Book Club Submitted by Marisa Cannata

Male members of the Lansing Jaycee may have been a little disturbed by the book club's first selection: **Tripping the Prom Queen: the Truth about Women and Rivalry** by Susan Shapiro Barash. As a feminist perspective on female relationships, the book exposes jealousy, competition, and sabotage between women that is hidden under the myth of female solidarity and companionship.

While the book club members (who happened to all be female) enjoyed some of the stories of female competition, we all agreed that the book became really repetitive after the introduction. Our conversation about the book included a

mixture of sharing our own stories of jealousy and competition with our female friends and relatives, and of finding flaws in the author's research methods and argument. For example, if you ask women to tell you about their experiences competing with other women, is it surprising that most of them give an example of female rivalry? This is a case of the author finding what she is looking for.

Also, the author emphasizes how women compete only with other women, and not with men, and that we compete over physical appearances, marriage and dating, and motherhood. It seems to me that if these are the domains in which women compete, it is natural that we are move envious of our sisters than our brothers. Maybe I am naïve as I have no kids, but I don't think anyone will ever say my brother is a better mother than me or looks better in a cocktail dress, although they might say that about my sister.

Tripping the Prom Queen definitely sparked lively conversation and storytelling in the book club meeting, so it was successful as the inaugural meeting of the Jaycee Book Club. But I think we decided to stick with fiction from now on.


