






PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Stuff the Bus is our annual event in which we help families in our community have a great holiday season. We are partnering with the Capital Area Transit Authority to park a bus outside Wal-Mart to collect items for families from the Volunteers of America Adopt a Family program.

Here's the logistics to know:

Saturday, Dec. 14, 2013, 9 a.m. – 8 p.m. Wal-Mart in Eastwood Towne Center 3225 Towne Center Blvd., Lansing, MI

Volunteers needed all day! Duties will include handing out lists of needed items to Wal-Mart patrons and helping to organize the bus once items are donated. Two hour shifts are available.

We will also need volunteers after the day of the event to sort, wrap and deliver items to families. More information will be out regarding volunteers soon!

For a personal touch, we thought we would share a couple of the stories from the families that we received. Consider the great impact this project has on our community and come help us out!

"I wish for my family to be adopted because as of this time I am unemployed. I am barely providing for my children. We have recently moved back to Lansing, MI from Detroit, MI because our house was broken into and EVERYTHING was stolen from their clothes, televisions, bikes, water heater, furnace, even the siding off of the house and all the pipes, to all of our furniture. They have no toys or anything to entertain them. We have been homeless for almost seven months and are now waiting on our house to be repaired because as of this time it is unlivable. I feel as if I'm letting my children down because they have struggled all year with me and have not complained once. I just want for one day to be about them and make them feel very special. I am pregnant and waiting on the birth of my fourth child. She will be born on 11/22/2013. I don't want to take from the other three and spoil their Christmas. They deserve much more. I would be really appreciative of the help that Volunteers of America could provide for us. After all Christmas is all about the kids and putting a smile on their faces and that's all that I want for Christmas is to see my kids happy."

"I am a single mother of three sons, two of who will be going to MSU on scholarship ... I work full-time, go to school full-time and take care of my family full-time. I am trying to provide for my family as a two parent household would, but at times it gets hard. Especially around the holidays. Any help I can get would be very much appreciated. Their father and father's side of the family is not involved in their lives so our family is very small. I would appreciate any help you could offer my boys and I this holiday season. Thank you in advance and God Bless you."



TREASURER REPORT

Paper Clips, one of the most common items you can find in your desk and/ or around the house and they have various useful uses. I would love to reference the source of this article...but I don't remember where I got it.

The paper clip was patented on Nov. 9, 1899 by William D. Middlebrook of Waterbury, CT. It was designed with round edges so it would tear paper. The shape hasn't changed since. Nearly 20 million pounds of paper clips are produced each year in the U.S.; many are still manufactured on the same machines that were used in the 1930's.

There are hundreds of potential uses for the common paper clip, here are a few:

Fix a Hem: Use the clip to keep folded-over fabric in place when sewing a simple hem, just slide it along the material as you work. A paper clip can also be used to hold an undone hem in place until there is time to sew it.

Repair Sunglasses: Replace the missing screw in your shades by sticking a small, opened paper clip in its place. Snip any excess metal with scissors or wire cutters.

Dye Easter Eggs: Use a large paper clip to clip eggs into the dye bath for an even color. Open the clip; bend one end into a circle, then push the other end up to make a handle. Place the egg in the circle and dunk.

Make a Banner: Craft a quick garland for a party with paper clips. Create a chain out of colorful paper clips and attach photos every few inches. Hang at eye level and enjoy.

Keep Tabs on Tea Bags: Prevent the tab on your tea bag from slipping into the water by weighing it down with a small paper clip. Dangle it over the side of the mug until you remove the bag.
