Hello to all Members, Prospects, and Capitol Correspondent Readers! The Lansing Jaycees have had quite a busy second quarter so far with Easter Egg Hunt, Tree Planting, Rebuilding Together and Touring Old Town. As we approach the busy and exciting months of summer, I reflect back on my goals for this year...where we have been and where I still



hope to go. One of my goals this year was to see our chapter reach out to at least six different populations including children, the homeless, veterans, animal shelters, domestic violence shelters, and the elderly. So far, we have worked with children, the homeless and veterans through various projects which we have participated in and I look forward to opportunities to share the Jaycees with other populations as well. 
## A Message from the Individual Development VP

- The movie premiered on Tuesday, September 13, 1994 at the Historic Renaissance Theatre in Mansfield, Ohio.
- The original story *Rita Hayworth and Shawshank Redemption* was written by Stephen King.
- Roger Ebert, a respected film critic, listed *The Shawshank Redemption* on his "Great Movies" list in 1999.
- Although *The Shawshank Redemption* was only a reasonable box office hit, it has become one of the most successful video and DVD rentals of all time.
- Academy Award Nomination for Best Actor in a Leading Role Morgan Freeman. Golden Globe Nomination for Best Performance by an Actor in a Motion Picture (Drama) Morgan Freeman.
- Though nominated for seven Oscars, including Best Picture, this fan favorite did not find its audience until it was released on home video just shy of the Academy Awards ceremony.
