In My Opinion

I LOVE to play games. Whether it's Trivial Pursuit, Yahtzee or Euchre, I'm always up for playing. I thought I would share some of my favorite games – hopefully you'll check some of them out!

5. Upwords

If you like Scrabble, you'll love Upwords. It's the ultimate word game. The tiles are stackable, so you can "build up" a word. For example, you can add one tile to change backer to packer, or add several letters to change gravy to funny. It is challenging and fun – you can pick a theme for the game, such as travel or the 80s, or something more risqué. Just make sure you have a dictionary handy!

4. Aggravation

Resurrect an old game from when you were a kid! Any game with a name meant to irritate has to be fun. It's a spin on Parcheesi and Backgammon. The object is to get your pieces "out," only to work them around the board to get them back "in." If I were a pessimist, I would think the concept ridiculous. But the fun you can have when you send someone back to the beginning is well worth it.

3. Catch Phrase

This is a great game if people don't know each other well and it's even better if you've been friends forever. The object is to get your team to guess words and not be left holding the clue machine. It's a complex form of Hot Potato. It's much more fun if you think outside the box. I remember having to describe the word cement. Instead of talking about how cement is used in sidewalks, I went with "It's the type of shoes the mob uses to whack people." Yes, it's twisted, but it's funny all the same. And it's a great game for a big group.

2. Would You Rather...?

If any of you knew what Zobmondo was, you'll love Would You Rather...? This is a game that stretches peoples' minds to make them choose between two equally odd, crazy, intriguing, bizarre or disgusting scenarios. The categories include Pain, Fear and Discomfort, Appearance Embarrassment, Ethics and Intellect, and a random, potpourri-like category. Some sample questions: Would you rather be a boy named Muffin or a girl named Arnold Jasper? Would you rather slide down a 1,000 foot rope with every part of your body covered except for your bare hands or do the same thing wearing only gloves and shorts? The cards are great to take on a road trip to spark interesting conversations.

1. Loaded Questions

By far, in my opinion, the best game EVER. Each person takes turns asking everyone a question. The other players write down their response, one of the responders reads the answers aloud. The person whose turn it is has to guess who said what. The questions range from the tame (How many hours on average do you sleep per night?) to the wild (When you want to feel sexy, what do you wear?) to the inspiring (If you could create a new ice cream, what would the flavor be? My favorite response: Salt.). This is a game where you can learn a ton about people, and truly stretch your imagination. Our favorite variation of the game is to skip the tame questions and only go for the fun ones. Be prepared to laugh to the point that your stomach will still hurt the next morning.
