7 Interview Questions You Need to Know

Job interviews can often be a scary prospect for people but they don't have to be. If you plan, think about, and prepare your answers in advance you can take on interviews with confidence. Check out some of the most commonly asked interview questions below along with helpful guidance on how to answer them.

✓ Tell me about yourself?

You should keep your answer brief, as this is normally a warm-up question. When talking about yourself you should cover four key topics: your early years, education, work history, and recent career experience. Emphasize your recent career experience the most as this is what the interviewer is really interested in.

✓ What do you know about our organization?

The interviewer is asking you this question to see if you have done any research on the company. You should be able to briefly discuss products, services, the brand, reputation, history and philosophy of the company. Most of this information can easily be found on the company's website.

✓ Why do you want to work for us?

You should say why you think the company is good, why you would enjoy the job itself, and how you believe your skills and experience would be an ideal fit for the company.

✓ Why are you leaving your current job?

Talking about why you are leaving your current job is always a tricky question. Be brief, to the point, and as honest as much as possible without damaging yourself. You should never mention anything negative like you hated your boss, had personality conflicts with colleagues, or a lack of belief in the company. Positive answers you can use are that you are looking for a new challenge or the opportunity to learn and develop new skills.

✓ Why should we hire you?

Take advantage of this golden opportunity to sell your self. You should talk about your experience of getting things done, your achievements, and any promotions you received. But remember to mention specific examples to back up everything you say.

✓ How do you deal with difficult customers or guests?

In the hospitality industry you deal with difficult guests on a daily basis so this can be a very important question for the interviewer. The best answer to give is always an example of a positive and successful outcome when dealing with an awkward guest. You will firstly need to show the interviewer your ability to empathize, understand, and obtain the guest's trust. Next you will show how you found the facts relevant to the guest's problem, how you worked within existing policies and procedures and lastly how you delivered a positive and satisfactory solution.

✓ Tell me about a big challenge or difficulty you've faced; how did you deal with it?

Avoid answering this question with anything really personal or emotional to you. The interviewer wants to know how you cope with challenges in the work place and not in your personal life. Try to prepare an example that's relevant to the role and shows how you used your strengths to reach a positive outcome.
