

### NOVEMBER ELECTIONS



This year has flown by and it is now time to start thinking about next year. Are you interested in learning and developing new leadership skills? Do you have ideas and suggestions you'd like to see implemented? Well, now is your chance. Elections will be held on November 11, 2003 at the general membership meeting for the 2004 board of directors. The following <u>officer</u> positions are available. Please take some time to review these and consider whether any of these positions fit into your future. These definitions are summaries of positions per the Lansing Jaycees corporate bylaws. Terms are two-years unless otherwise indicated.

<u>President</u> - The president is essentially the CEO overseeing general business and affairs of the organization. The president also presides over all meeting of the membership for the first year of election. The following year, the president serves as chair of the board.

<u>Vice Presidents</u> - Vice presidents shall supervise the portfolios of committees, chair the standing committees and perform other duties as necessary. If the president is suspended by the board of directors for just cause, the board shall designate a vice president to assume the duties of the president. Pinnacle areas typically include Community Development, Individual Development, Membership Development and Management Development.

<u>Secretary</u> - The secretary keeps the minutes of the membership and board meetings. The secretary may be responsible for conducting all official correspondence and may maintain custody of any records, documents or communications not assigned to another officer.

<u>Treasurer</u> - The treasurer maintains custody of the corporate funds, maintains record of receipts and disbursements and verifies that disbursements have been duly authorized by the board of directors. The treasurer shall also be responsible for preparation of all tax returns and external financial reports.

<u>Assistant Treasurer</u> - Assists the treasurer as necessary and perform such other duties as assigned by the bylaws, board or president.

<u>State Directors</u> - State directors shall represent the Lansing Jaycees at meetings of the Michigan Jaycees. They shall cast their votes at the Michigan Jaycee meeting in accordance with the instructions of the Lansing Jaycees board of directors. There may be one or may state directors elected to a term of one year.

<u>Legal Counsel</u> - Legal Counsel shall represent the Lansing Jaycees in legal matters affecting the organization. This position is for a one-year term.

<u>Parliamentarian</u> - The parliamentarian assists the presiding officer in questions of parliamentary procedures at membership and board meetings.

<u>Chaplain</u> - Perform all duties and powers incident to the office of Chaplain. This is a one-year term.

If none of these offices catch your interest in this time, there are also general director positions. Directors help the officers wherever necessary. If you have any questions about any of these offices please contact myself or any of the current board of directors. Remember, the success of our organization depends on you - the membership.



#### Best place to get fudge

If you can get up early, go to Murray's Hotel, where fudge is 6.95/lb. during their Early Bird Special from 8 - 10 a.m. If not, prices are pretty consistent everywhere, and you really can't go wrong at any of the shops. But some such as Ryba's and Joann's also have the added benefit of selling other goodies like ice cream and taffy. Most stores will also ship gift boxes of fudge anywhere in the United States.

#### **Best entertainment**

Be sure to stop in at the Pink Pony Lounge at the Chippewa Hotel. Mary McGuire sings an amazing range of folk and rock, takes song requests (although she prefers not to sing "boy songs" – songs that are obviously from a man to a woman) and even offers book recommendations. When I requested anything by the Indigo Girls, she sang Galileo and from the stage suggested that I read a recently published book of letters between Galileo and his daughter. Mary is talented enough that I would have been happy to just sit and listen, but even sitting right in front of the stage the volume was at a level that allowed conversation without shouting. Mary takes the stage most nights at 10 p.m., and you can also find her bartending during the day at Horn's Bar. The Pink Pony also had entertaining bartenders, one of whom grew up on the island and tried somewhat unsuccessfully to convince us of the normality of life in a place where there are only 7 people in your high school class. They also showed us some pictures of a couple of the previous week's patrons who appeared to be practicing their Mardi Gras bead-getting skills.

#### Best place to buy a book for lounging at the pool/beach

The Island Bookstore has all the usual bestsellers, plus a fascinating selection of featured books that I would never think to look for on my own. From books purchased at the Island Bookstore I've learned about scandals of rulers and royalty throughout history, the Nevada brothels, a housekeeper who managed to house several Jews in the basement of her Nazi employer during World War II, and the trials and tribulations of a career waitress. The Island Bookstore is located under the Lilac Tree Hotel and is open from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. daily.

#### Best place to stay

Your options include everything from quaint bed and breakfasts to budget hotels (well, as budget as they get on Mackinac) to the spectacularly overpriced and overrated Grand Hotel. It all depends on your vacation priorities, but after trying out all of the above my personal favorite is Mission Point Resort. Unlike most island hotels, they have a pool and hot tub, as well as other resort amenities including a salon, organized activities for kids, and tennis courts. There are great lunch options – you can get a burger delivered to your lounge chair at the pool or go to the deli and choose from a large selection of salads, pastas, sandwiches, or Pizza Hut pizza. The resort is close enough to downtown to be an easy walk, but far enough away to be an escape from the throngs of people crowding the shops and sidewalks. As it turns out Mission Point is also a good place to hang out with the local wildlife. While enjoying a bottle of wine in the giant tepee-like lobby one evening, we were joined by several bats and one huge toad. We just ducked when the bats circled, but decided to help out the toad and move it back outside.

#### Best way to learn some Michigan history and get a workout at the same time

Take a walk up to Fort Mackinac, used first by the British in the 18<sup>th</sup> century, then later by the American military. You can see how the soldiers lived, hear the cannons fired and learn about the history of the fort and the island. Then rent a bike (to find a bike rental stand anywhere downtown and take no more than 10 steps in any direction) and ride to the island cemetery, where you can see the actual graves of many of the people you've just read about at the fort. I have to admit that I'm a wimp and actually almost cried while pedaling up the hill, but as I've seen hundreds of other people of all ages and sizes make this ride, I think it's safe to say that for people less lazy than me this trip would be an enjoyable experience.


